2. To improve the health and wellbeing of students and to promote active lifestyles.	Students to engage in active time throughout the day	n/a	Being active is integral to health and wellbeing. Starting this regime at primary ages sets the foundations to be further developed in later life. Students to engage in physical activity throughout break times and after school where applicable.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport.	ED-Start to run coaching a mentoring opportunities for staff during their time in school.	See point 1	Teachers to have a higher confidence in delivering PE and meeting the expected targets for development needs for their students.
4. To develop students swimming abilities so that they can work towards government recommended targets on conclusion of KS2.	Pupils of Year 6 cohort in 2021-22 able to swim competently and proficiently over a distance of 25 metres. Pupils work towards using a range of strokes effectively. Pupils work towards performing a safe self-rescue.	£2,175	Swimming lessons to take place 1 day per week all academic year.
